### CLEP exam

- Choose a CLEP exam that 1) will be beneficial in completing the degree you intend to pursue and 2) maximizes knowledge you already have while also 3) familiarizing students to standardized testing formats.
- Advisors may assist students in finding study resources to prepare for the exam. This may include recommending that students purchase a CLEP study guide for that exam or recommending a textbook for students to work through.

### Online course

- Choose an online course that 1) will introduce you to online studies, 2) will be beneficial in completing the degree you intend to pursue, and 3) will introduce the student to the college/university at which you plan to study.
- Advisors may assist students in the college enrollment process, including completing the FAFSA.
- Online courses should involve minimal time demands on Institute instructors, but interaction between students and instructors is expected and encouraged.
