## TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAM


**FROM THE ARCHIVES:** This article by Melvin Lehman is reprinted from Issue 29 of Faith Builders' newsletter, originally published February 1993.

The Christian day school movement in America is a fairly recent phenomenon.

Most Mennonite parochial schools were started in the last twenty years.

These schools were started because of various concerns about

the public schools: lack of discipline, inappropriate content being taught, bad influences of teach-



During the infancy of the parochial school movement many people felt that parochial schools would solve any of the problems we had with our young people. Now we have come to see that running a parochial school that is truly Christian and assists the church in achieving its goals is a very difficult task.

What are some of the primary problems encountered in the operation of a Christian school?

First, there is a woeful shortage of dedicated brothers and sisters who are qualified to teach. We are truly indebted to those dear people who have entered the class-room with no training and no experience. Some survived, but many did not. There is absolutely no reason why this method of "teacher training" should continue. FBEP intends to offer an alternative method of teacher training.

Second, good, high-quality curriculum is hard to find. However, since we already have some fine organizations that are producing curriculum with an appropriate Christian emphasis, FBEP feels that more emphasis must be placed on training the teacher. For this reason FBEP will begin by concentrating on teacher training.

A legitimate question arises at this point. Why not let our potential teachers go to an existing accredited college and obtain state certification? I will answer this question by reflecting on what FBEP thinks potential teachers should learn in a teacher-training program.

1. A qualified teacher must be filled with the Spirit of the living God. In teachers this quality must especially express itself in wholesome human relationships. This is vital to good teaching. Is this quality


- emphasized in most accredited institutions?
- 2. A qualified teacher is a humble servant. Competent teachers are highly trained in academic fields of study but are not high-minded about their training. FBEP intends to maintain high academic standards while promoting the idea that humility and servanthood are the most important accreditation.
- 3. A qualified teacher is a wholesome person with a well-rounded education. Good teachers often get their hands dirty. At FBEP we believe it is very important for everyone—including teachers—to have a skill or trade in which they can exercise themselves as productive members of their communities. This is not an isolated compartment in the teacher's life. It is a significant part of his profession and speaks volumes to the students who sit under him from day to day.
- 4. A qualified teacher has an unswerving loyalty to TRUTH. When confronted with valid challenges to his preconceived notions or dogmatic attitudes, he seeks to know what is right and true.
